No change in America's stand on J&K: Biden

Washington, Feb. 12: Biden administration on Wednesday said that there is no change in the US' policy on Jammu and Kashmir and welcomed the resumption of 4G mobile internet in the region.

"I want to be very clear there has been no

change in US policy in the region," State Department Spokesperson Ned Price told reporters following a tweet from the South and Central Asia Bureau of the State Department which welcomed the resumption of 4G mobile internet in Jammu and Kashmir.

"We welcome the

resumption of 4G mobile internet in India's Jammu & Kashmir. This marks an important step for local residents and we look forward to continued political & economic progress to restore normalcy in J&K," tweeted the South and Central Asia Bureau of the State Department.

Biden raises US' concerns in 2-hour phone call with Xi

Washington, Feb. 12: US President Joe Biden in his maiden phone call with his Chinese counterpart Xi Jinping talked about the fundamental concerns he has with Beijing's coercive and unfair economic practices. White House Press Secretary Jen Psaki said on Thursday, a day after the two-hour-long conversation between the two leaders.

Biden wants to lead with a clear and compelling affirmative US policy agenda and take steps to strengthen the US economy, she said.

"He wants to work with our partners and allies, as you've seen from the readouts we've done from the President's engagement. He wants to take steps across government..." Psaki told reporters at her daily news conference.

"He also is committed to being clear and candid in his engagements, as

he was last night in... his lengthy conversation with President Xi, where he talked about the fundamental concerns he has, we have, about Beijing's coercive and unfair economic practices. That obviously covers a range of concern, a range of issues: the crackdown in Hong Kong, human rights abuse across the country, increasingly assertive actions in the region, including toward Taiwan," Psaki said.

President Biden, she said, is clear-eyed about the challenge that the US facing - that's the strategic competition with China. "In order to get on our best footing in that competition, we need to take steps here at home, including making our own workforce more competitive, ensuring we are taking steps to protect our own technology, ensuring that...we are working with our partners and allies to do that," she said.

"It is a reflection

of our strategy, which is that we are going to get our house in order, in order to come into that competition from the strongest footing possible," she said.

State Department Spokesperson Ned Price said the Biden Administration will engage with the Chinese when it is consistent with American interests and values. "We wanted to make sure that we had coordinated closely with our allies, including our allies in Europe and our treaty allies in the Indo-Pacific, but also our partners, including our partners throughout the Indo-Pacific, to make clear that our approach to Beijing was known to them, that we coordinated on that, and that, again, we positioned ourselves vis-a-vis China in the strongest possible position," Price said when asked about the delay in talks with the Chinese President.

High-speed mobile internet was restored on February 5 in the entire union territory of Jammu and Kashmir, exactly one and a half years after it was snapped in August 2019 when the Centre had abrogated the special status of the erstwhile state.

Meanwhile, Pakistan on Thursday expressed disappointment at the reference to Jammu and Kashmir in the US State Department's tweet regarding the resumption of 4G mobile internet in Jammu and Kashmir.

"The reference is inconsistent with the disputed status of Jammu and Kashmir as recognised by numerous United Nations Security Council (UNSC) resolutions and the international community," Foreign Office said in a statement in Islamabad.

According to a 2019 Congressional Research Service report of August 2019, a longstanding goal of US policy in South Asia has been to prevent the India-Pakistan conflict from escalating to interstate war.

This meant the United States has sought to avoid actions that overtly favoured either party. Over the past decade, however, Washington has grown closer to India while relations with Pakistan continue to be viewed as clouded by mistrust, CRS report said.

India-Australia FMs discuss Myanmar, Indo-Pacific

New Delhi, Feb. 12: External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar and his Australian counterpart Marise Payne on Thursday reviewed developments in the Indo-Pacific region and discussed the situation in Myanmar following the military coup.

In a telephonic conversation, the two foreign ministers also discussed ways to make coronavirus vaccines accessible and affordable.

"Good as always to talk to FM @MarisePayne. Discussed developments in the Indo-Pacific. Exchanged views on the situation in Myanmar. Also on making vaccines accessible & affordable. And a bit of cricket," Jaishankar tweeted.

Last week, Myanmar's military grabbed power in a coup against the civilian government.

On her part, Payne said Australia and India will work "more closely" than ever on their shared objectives in the Indo-Pacific, she said on Twitter.

"Today @DrJaishankar and I discussed the situation in Myanmar, equitable & safe access to vaccines and taking forward our Comprehensive Strategic Partnership," she said.

The defence and security ties between India and Australia have been on an upswing in the last few years.

During an online summit between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Australian counterpart Scott Morrison in June last, India and Australia elevated their ties to a

comprehensive strategic partnership and signed a landmark deal for reciprocal access to military bases for logistic support.

The Mutual Logistics Support Agreement (MLSA) allows militaries of the two countries to use each other's bases for repair and replenishment of supplies, besides facilitating scaling up

of overall defence cooperation.

The Australian Navy was part of the Malabar naval exercise hosted by India in November. The navies of the US and Japan were also part of it.

India and Australia have been boosting cooperation bilaterally as well as under the framework of Quad with

an aim to ensure peace, security and stability in the Indo-Pacific region.

The Quad, comprising India, the US, Australia and Japan, is aimed at ensuring a free and open Indo-Pacific.

The Malabar exercise was largely seen as a prelude to future military cooperation among the Quad member nations.

China bans BBC news broadcasts in retaliatory move

Beijing, Feb. 12: China has banned BBC World News from airing in China, one week after threatening to retaliate for the recent revocation of the British broadcasting license for China's state-owned CGTN.

The National Radio and Television Administration said in a statement dated midnight Friday that BBC World News coverage of China had violated requirements that news reporting be true and impartial and undermined China's national interests and ethnic solidarity.

The BBC already is generally not viewable in China outside of some hotels, businesses and residential compounds for foreigners. It wasn't immediately clear if the ban would affect reception in those

facilities.

The Chinese government has criticised recent BBC reports on the COVID-19 pandemic in China and on allegations of forced labor and sexual abuse in the Xinjiang region, home to the Uighurs and other predominantly Muslim ethnic groups.

The channel fails to meet the requirements to broadcast in China as an overseas channel, the Radio and Television Administration said, adding it would not accept BBC's broadcast application for the next year.

U.K. Foreign Secretary Dominic Raab called the move an unacceptable curtailing of media freedom that would "only damage China's reputation in the eyes of the world. Britain's communications

watchdog, Ofcom, revoked the license for CGTN, China's English-language satellite news channel, on Feb. 4. It cited links to China's ruling Communist Party among the reasons.

A Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson said the next day that Ofcom had acted on political grounds based on ideological bias" and that China reserves the right to respond to protect the rights and interests of Chinese media.

Losing its British broadcasting license was a major setback for CGTN. The channel has a European operations hub in West London and is part a government push to expand China's soft power and burnish its image abroad.

Virtual 'India Toy Fair' from Feb 27

New Delhi, Feb. 12: The first India Toy Fair will be held virtually from February 27 to March 2, the government announced on Thursday.

The website for the India Toy Fair 2021 which was launched on Thursday will enable children, parents, teachers, exhibitors, etc. to register themselves to participate in the virtual fair which will showcase various facets of the Indian toy ecosystem.

According to officials, it is the first ever digitally accessible exhibition and platform which will provide an opportunity to explore and buy a variety of toys from over 1,000 exhibitors across states and union territories, and participate in insightful webinars,

panel discussions and activities, and network with various stakeholders from the toy industry.

"About a year back, complaints were received about poor quality, cheap toys being imported into the country, adversely affecting the Indian toy industry," Union Minister Piyush Goyal said at the launch of the website.

"The matter was examined by a committee which found that 30 per cent of the imported plastic toys were having large amounts of chemicals and heavy metals, way beyond the prescribed levels. Other toys were also found to be deficient in quality. This led to the issue of quality control order for toys. This initiative will ensure that Indians get

access to quality toys," he said.

Education minister Ramesh Pokhriyal 'Nishank', said, "Indian toys have been the building blocks of a happy childhood and play-based, discovery-based and activity-based learning plays an integral role in bridging the gap between day-to-day studies and practical hands-on learning which is a prime focus of the new National Education Policy."

Stating that the Indian toy industry is a source of livelihood for many artisans and micro enterprises, Union Minister of Textiles and Women and Child Development Smriti Irani said that six ministries of the Union government

have joined hands to make the fair a "grand success".

"In a big boost to the toy manufacturing industry under the Aatmanirbhar Bharat campaign, this initiative is being taken to bring transformative change in the industry by being 'Vocal for Local,'" she said.

The main attractions of the fair include a virtual exhibition with over 1,000 stalls, knowledge sessions with engaging panel discussions and webinars on diverse topics by experts on areas including toy-based learning, craft demonstrations, competitions, quizzes, virtual tours, product launches, etc.
