Edappadi promises welfare board to uplift Valayar community

Madurai, Feb 1: Chief Minister Edappadi K Palaniswami assured that a welfare board would be formed for uplifting Valayar community.

Addressing Valayar Vazhvirimai conference, organised by Veera Mutharaiyir Munnetra Sangam here on Sunday, drew historical references and lauded the community for their contribution to Sangam literature.

He said that the kings from the community were renowned philanthropists. "People from the community have taken farming as a major occupation. Being a farmer myself, I am proud of them and can relate with their needs," he said.

He noted that as announced in the Assembly, the foundation stone for the memorial of Perumbidugu Mutharaiyir was laid by him in Tiruchy. He recalled that former Chief Minister J Jayalalitha had brought various farmer-friendly schemes and that she took up legal fights and succeeded in Cauvery and Mullaiperiyar issues.

"She had implemented rainwater harvesting to augment the groundwater table, which is the primary source of water for farming. In the same lines, the 'Amma government' led by me, has implemented Kudimaramathu scheme across

the State. Further, the Cauvery Delta region has also been declared a Protected Special Agriculture Zone," he said.

Chief Minister said the AIADMK-led government in Tamil Nadu would be supportive to the Mutharaiyar commu-

nity, who largely rely on agriculture. Farmers toil under sun, work hard on soil and hence they need to be praised. The state government is committed to safeguard the interest of farmers.

In the best interest of the farming community, former chief minister and AIADMK supremo J Jayalalitha introduced rainwater harvesting system and the same government launched 'kudimaramathu' scheme to ensure that no single drop of rainwater gets wasted. He also recalled Jayalalitha's efforts in retrieving the rights of Tamil Nadu on issues concerning Cauvery River water and Mullaiperiyar dam.

Meanwhile, the Chief Minister also ensured that statues of 'Perasar' Perumbidugu Mutharaiyir, a king who ruled Tiruchy and Thanjavur region in the days of yore, would be installed at two locations, including Valayarkulam and Anaiyur in Madurai.

In June last, foundation stone was laid for building manimandapam for Perumbidugu Mutharaiyir, he recalled during the meeting.

Rejuvenation of Cauvery

The Chief Minister said that to rehabilitate and rejuvenate Cauvery river, 'Nadanthai Vaazhi Cauvery' project to the tune of Rs 10,700 has

been undertaken by the 'Amma government'.

"Works are underway for Godavari-Cauvery river linking project. "If water is diverted from Cauvery to Gundar, districts including Tiruchy, Pudukkottai, Sivaganga, Virudhunagar and Ram-anathapuram would flourish.

As part of the first phase of the plan, Rs.6,800-crore worth works have been commenced. Further, Kallanai canal, which has not been rejuvenated in a long time, would be renovated at a cost of Rs 2,700 crore soon," he said.

Modi to inaugurate Metro Rail service, other projects in TN on Feb 14

Chennai, Feb 1: Prime Minister Narendra Modi is set to visit Chennai on February 14 to inaugurate a host of events, including opening Metro Rail services from Washermenpet to Wimco Nagar.

Chennai: "Apart from the Metro Rail services, Prime Minister will also inaugurate Cauvery-Gunnar river interlinking project. He will also par-

ticipate in a party meeting where he is set to meet the Tamil Nadu BJP leaders to discuss the party strategy in the upcoming state Assembly election," said a source in the state BJP unit.

Chief Minister Edappadi K Palaniswami had recently visited Delhi to invite Modi to inaugurate the Metro Rail services and a host of other government projects. Party

sources also said that the Prime Minister might address a public meeting and will be involved in election campaigning during his visit but the number of days of his visit has not yet been confirmed. "Seat sharing between the AIADMK and BJP is also expected to be finalised during the PM's visit," the source added.

Classes for students of colleges, classes 9 and 11 to commence in TN from Feb 8

CM extends lockdown with relaxations till Feb 28

Chennai, Feb 1: Classes for students of all colleges, universities and those studying ninth and eleventh grades in schools would commence from February 8, Chief Minister K Palaniswami announced.

While classes for students of 10 and 12 started from January 19 and hostel facilities for them also opened this month, the government said classes for ninth and eleventh grades would start from February 8.

Hostel facilities for students of colleges, varsities and those in schools shall also open.

The classes for college and university students covered undergraduate, postgraduate and diploma courses in all streams including arts, science, engineering, agriculture and fisheries.

Extends lockdown

As regards religious, political, social, cultural, entertainment and educational events, 50 per cent capacity or a maximum

of 600 people would be allowed in indoor auditoriums from February 1, he said.

For games including cricket, 50 per cent occupancy is allowed in stadiums, he said.

Chennai is all set to host two test matches against England beginning February 5. Authorities have already announced that spectators would not be allowed for the first test.

From February 1, Palaniswami said 100 per cent occupancy shall be allowed in all types of movie theatres including single screens and multiplexes, he said in an official release announcing fresh relaxations from curbs, initiated to help prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Swimming pools, exhibition halls, grievance redressal day events in districts, a ritual of "Theerthamaduthal" in the temple town of Rameswaram are all allowed and petrol stations that

were allowed to operate only till 10 pm could function without any restriction.

For events in open grounds too, the present norm of a maximum 50 per cent capacity shall continue.

Guidelines and Standard Operating Procedures issued by the government for preventing the spread of COVID-19 would apply, Palaniswami said and appealed to people to follow social distancing, wear masks and wash hands with soap and water.

The Tamil Nadu government had on January 8 cancelled its order permitting 100 per cent occupancy in cinema theatres citing an advisory from the Centre and a petition in the Madras High Court for revoking its decision.

The government had on January 4 permitted full capacity in cinemas ahead of the release of actor Vijay starrer "Master" on January 13 on the eve of "Pongal" festival.

Book fair from February 24 at YMCA

Chennai, Feb 1: The annual Chennai Book Fair will be held from February 24 until March 9 at the YMCA grounds.

According to members of the Book Sellers' and Publishers' Association of South India (BAPASI), "The fair will go on from 11 am until 8pm. Confirming the announcement, K Nagarajan, Vice President of BAPASI said, "We will ensure all Covid protocols are in place including creating wider pathways. Other than that, everything including the ticket system will be the same."

CM announces solatium to kin of 41 killed in various incidents

Chennai, Feb 1: Chief minister Edappadi K Palaniswami has announced a relief of Rs 3 lakh each to the families of 17 people, who died due to unnatural causes recently. This includes kin of 15 people, who died of electrocution and two, who died of snake bite. A solatium of Rs 51 lakh will be disbursed from the chief minister's public relief fund.

Palaniswami also announced solatium of Rs. 1 lakh each to the families of 24 persons died in various incidents.

R Silambarasan of Usi-

lampatti in Madurai district and P Kaliappan of Kavundipalayam in Namakkal district were electrocuted while repairing an electric post; the others include Devasagayam of Nallaperumalpatti in Madurai, P Pechiammal of Melakal in Madurai, L Agniveeran of Ammapatti in Madurai, Senthil of Sarugulayalpatti in Madurai, P Murugan of Thotampatti in Madurai, P Shankar of Vadanerkundram in Villupuram district, M Saminathan of Medavakkam in Chengalpattu district, P Manikandan of Anniman-

galam in Ariyalur district, Alagarsamy of Paamboor in Ramanathapuram district, S Kishore of Ahadvathur village in Trichy district, P Manoharan of Pallur in Ranipet district, P Murugaraj of Kaatuvelai in Kanyakumari and A Anthonyammal of Veerattakaram in Kallakurichi district.

The victims, who died of snake bite are S Gokulan from Kakaveri in Namakkal district and K Monisha of Periyachemur in Erode district.

Tirupur Jagannathan, Udumalpet Sanjai and Akash, Tenkasi Dhana-

pal, Kanyakumari Agis, Sagaya Suresh, Chennai Philipkumar, Manikandan, Tamilselvan, Namakkal Diyanesh, Santhoskumar, Nagai Vijaykumar, Sivagangai Chandrasekar, Kallakurichi Madhan, Yogesh, Sameera, Villupuram Bharathkumar, Tiruchi Yashwant, Cud-

alore Maari, Ranipet Jagan, Abinaya, Tiruvannamalai Sneha, Nilgiris Ganesh, died by drowning and Tiruvannamalai Settu died by bee bite.

Inspector Kavitha launches skill development training for Korukkupet students

Chennai, Feb 1: Inspector Kavitha of Chennai Korukkupet has launched a new initiative to train school children in skills development including painting, bharamatnam and boxing.

Since the beginning of Lockdown in Chennai in March last year, school students have been attending online classes from home. On the orders of Police Commissioner Maheshkumar Agarwal, the police are trying to improve the performance of school children living in slums



in Chennai. Accordingly, painting competitions and essay competitions were conducted online and prizes were awarded

to them. They were also given corona awareness. Following this, Law and order inspec-

tor Kavitha has made a new attempt to develop this review for school children and students at the Korukkupet police station in the Washermenpet police district of Chennai.

Accordingly, he has taken action to keep the poor school students living around the Korukkupet police station to develop their individuality. On the orders of Commissioner Maheshkumar Agarwal, Additional Commissioner Arun, Joint Commissioner Balakrishnan and Washermenpet Deputy

Commissioner Subbulati are supervising the work.

"The training is being imparted to poor students living in slums in areas including Ranganathan Street and Thirunavukarasu Estate in the Korukkupet area. Students from 1st class to 12th class are invited to participate. A separate place has been allotted for this at the Korukkupet police station.

Every day while patrolling the Korukkupet areas, we meet the public and parents

who live there and tell them about it in person. Painting experts are called in to teach painting and it is taught to children.

Not only that, it has been arranged to teach children English fluently and to teach Bharatanatyam.

The school has also been advised to teach martial arts like boxing and karate to the students," said Inspector Kavitha.
